The book begins with an introductory chapter followed by eleven case study chapters demonstrating the nexus between biodiversity, health, and sustainable development, and then a synthesis chapter clarifying the relevance of the case study findings to policy and academic discussions. It will be of interest to scholars, policymakers, and professionals in the field related to sustainable development. This volume contains 117 reviewed papers from over 30 countries, published in English, French and Spanish, which reflect both international dimension of FRIEND and the key challenges facing hydrologists in the 21st century. Tropical forests are shaped both by anthropogenic and natural disturbances. In this dissertation, I discuss

results from my research conducted in the Yucatan peninsula, Mexico. This system provides a good example of forests that are at the human-nature interface. My research examined how forest structure and composition was recovered following two main disturbances common to the region: slash-and-burn agriculture ("milpas") and hurricanes. Chapter 1 focuses on the fate of "mature-forest" species (those found exclusively or predominantly in forests older than 50 yrs) in sites previously used for milpa agriculture. Following a chronosequence methodology, I looked at various successional stages, analyzing changes in vegetation structure and composition across forest age. My results suggest that while forest structure tends to converge to that of the mature forest in approximately 30 to 50 years, the species composition is not recovering in the same way, and the establishment of some mature-forest species may be compromised. Chapter 2 complements the first one; I examined the feasibility of successfully introducing mature-forest species in sites previously used as milpas. For this, I planted seeds of three mature-forest species in different successional stages (recently abandoned milpas, early successional forest, and old forest), and followed their survival for two years. My results showed similar survival trends in those seeds introduced in early successional and old forests, suggesting that once initial successional has started this method is a feasible strategy to accelerate forest succession and ensure mature-forest species establishment. Chapter 3 was developed after two category-5 hurricanes crossed my study site. In this chapter, I describe forest vegetation damage and recovery, and explore whether two consecutive disturbances have cumulative effects. Results showed defoliation was the most common damage, and it doubled after the second disturbance. Interestingly, mature-forest species experienced less damage than others did. In addition to the ecological research, my dissertation includes the opinions diverse stakeholders have regarding conservation in the area. Chapter 4 analyzes the context of local conservation and reviews future expectations of traditional agricultural practices in the area. It highlights the contested visions among stakeholders, which is an important step to develop successful management strategies. The peninsula's natural assets also include notable Mayan temples. With poverty far from eliminated, and with economic development opportunities beckoning in agriculture, manufacturing, and hydrocarbon development, the region is under growing risks from environmental hazards. Oil spills, hurricanes, coral bleaching, extreme flooding, and erosion have all been experienced in this region over the past decade. Based on preliminary identification of environmental priorities, Opportunities for Environmentally Healthy, Inclusive, and Resilient Growth in Mexico's Yucatán Peninsula explores selected topics that aim to inform decision making in the region. A general context of integrated coastal zone management is used to explore issues, constraints, and potential solutions, and the role of geomorphology is examined with a view to identifying how shore management plans can contribute to improved coastal management. Economic studies find that the main environmental health risks in the peninsula result in more than 1,000 premature deaths every year and in more than 9.36 million days lost to illnesses. These risks generate substantial economic losses, representing 2.2†–3.3 percent of gross regional income. Scenarios relating to the economic cost of extreme weather events generate similar levels of damages: 1.4†–1.5 percent of GDP in 2020 and 1.6†–2.3 percent of GDP in 2050. A social accounting matrix examines the social and environmental interconnectedness to the various parts of the economy, and an institutional analysis considers the mandates of existing institutions in the states, and of the contribution that regulatory measures may make to environmentally sustainable development without undermining economic growth prospects. With one

In six chapters, the text bridges Western and Indigenous Knowledge (IK) approaches to achieve deeper understanding of IKs, focusing on more Indigenous-centered methods, with the goal of expanding the disciplinary perspectives of postcolonial scholarship and Indigenous geographies.
